WORLD DAY OF PRAYERS FOR VOCATIONS

Today is a day when Christians are invited to reflect on the meaning of God's call and to pray that they may answer the call to dedicate their lives to serve the Church in a special way, i.e., to shepherd the Church communities, particularly as pastors in Itheir parishes and as superiors in their religious orders or congregations.

The Church presents to us in today's Gospel the figure of Jesus the Good Shepherd that we may reflect on the meaning of the religious vocation to priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life. Last Sunday we reflected on Our Lord's commission and ! charge to Peter, saying thrice, "Feed my lambs." In I that way he made Peter a shepherd, a pastor. Our Lord continues his work of shepherding his people I through Peter and his co-workers (the apostles and idisciple), and through their successors, the Pope, the bishops, priests, deacons, catechists, and committed lay people.

The first thing we need to remember is that every single person here has a vocation! Each person here, whatever one's state in life, has been, and is being, called by God through the Holy Spirit to offer !one's special gifts to benefit the rest of the community. Therefore, "Vocations Sunday" is not just for the few selected for directly religious vocations; it is for ALL of us here.

On the one hand, each one needs to reflect on ! what one's particular calling is and how one can! respond to it for the well-being of the whole parish I community. Secondly, one needs to help others, I and not be an obstacle to them as they respond to I the particular calling and graces that God through i his Spirit is giving one. If we will all actively respond; to that call, what a wonderful community, we will: be! For, by God's grace, "We are his people, the: sheep of his flock.

Have you ever seen the painting done in the 1930s : of a dog, looking with a cocked head, at an old! gramophone? The name of the painting is His! Master's Voice. This serves us today as a symbol of I

what Jesus is saying to us: "The sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out."

7 Helpful Ways to Listen to God

1. Believe God desires to speak to you.

Trust God with the process and be willing to learn at His pace. Let God know how much you want to hear from Him. Remember, He is your heavenly Father who loves you deeply.

2. Cultivate quiet.

The world is a noisy, busy place, and so is our mind. When our thoughts race with too many concerns, we struggle to

To wait for God is to be still, to make quiet, to stop, to rest. Waiting for God instead of allowing our thoughts and emotions to spiral helps us to hear God more clearly.

3. Read the Bible as a conversation with God.

The Bible is God's Word to us. As we read, we are hearing from God as the Holy Spirit begins to engage our minds, drawing our attention to particular concepts. Meditating on the truths God brings to our attention is a way of continuing the

4. Rely on the Holy Spirit to be your helper, teacher, and quide.

Listening begins with God. His Word is living and active through the work of the Holy Spirit (Hebrews 4:12). Ask the Spirit to open your ears and empower you to perceive God's words to you.

5. Pray God's Word.

Let the words of a passage guide or inspire your prayer. As the Spirit helps us to pray, He brings situations, people, truths, praises, or confessions to mind.

6. Ask God questions.

Questions are a powerful way to go beyond the surface. They invite exploration and discovery as well as deeper intimacy with God.

We can ask questions about what we are reading:

- What does this word mean?
- What do you want me to understand about this passage?
- How does this concept apply to my life?

We can also ask:

- Is there anything you want me to see about this situation?
- How can I look at this from your perspective?
- Why does this situation bother me so much?
- What is this really about?

When God speaks, it always agrees with His Word and His character. As we learn more of God through regularly reading and studying the Bible, we discern His voice more easily.

7. Keep a prayer journal.

There is a spiritual and neurological connection between of writing and understanding. Journaling can be a form of listening as we express and explore. God often uses writing to help us listen as the Spirit works through our thoughts, discoveries, and insights.
