## HERE ARE 10 ENCOURAGEMENTS FOR PRAYING IN YOUR DOMESTIC CHURCH.

Remember that your home is a domestic church, a place where the Father desires to bestow graces whenever He is welcomed.

Designate a specific place a corner, chair, or room — for spending time with Jesus and abiding in His Sacred Heart.

Decide on a particular time and duration by examining your heart with Jesus.

Light a candle to remind your senses that this time is set apart from the other demands of your day.

Place a crucifix and a holy image (such as Mary and Joseph or a favorite saint) in your space to meditate upon. These visuals will remind you of the communion of saints praying for you and with you during this time.



Select a passage from scripture or a spiritual reading beforehand. The focus should allows be on Jesus.

**Remember** that Jesus desires to bring His presence and His heart into your home to dwell among you.

Engage with the selected passage or prayer material through lectio diving.

Jesus wants to be a part of your day, but more than that, He wants you to be a part of His 'day.'

Protect and defend your time. You may have a busy day, but resist being tempted to cut yourself off from you source of life. The enemy fights against things that take away his power.





# **The Most Unpromising Boy in my Class**

with one of his students. He wrote in his roll book concerning this student: "He is the smallest, the meekest, the most unpromising boy in my class." Half a century later, an election was held in France to select the greatest Frenchman. By popular vote, that meekest, smallest, most unpromising boy was chosen. His name? Louis Pasteur (1822-1895), the founder of modern medicine. When he was seventy-three, a national holiday was declared in his honor. He was too weak to attend the ceremony in Paris, so he sent a message to be read by his son. The message read: "The future belongs not to the conquerors but to the saviors of the

world" [Edward Chinn, Wonder of Words (Lima, Ohio: C.S.S. Publishing Co., Inc., 1987), p. 18].

Louis Pasteur was driven by a great purpose. Your name and my name may never be a household word like Pasteur's, but we, too, can be driven by a great purpose. Christ can give us that purpose. But there is one thing more Christ gives us. He gives us the presence of the Holy! Spirit as promised in today's gospel. A healthy! sense of identity and a driving purpose are not! enough in themselves. One more thing is! needed. It is the in-dwelling Spirit of the living! God.
