





A Poor Sinner, Your Brother

In Vienna, there is a church where the deceased members of the former ruling family of Austria, the Habsburgs, are buried. When the royal funeral processions arrived at this church, the mourners would knock at the great doors and ask to be allowed in. From inside, the priest would ask, "Who is it that desires admission here?" The mourners would respond, "His Apostolic Majesty, the Emperor."

The priest would then reply, "I do not know him." They would knock a second time, and again the priest would ask, "Who is there?" The answer would come: "The highest Emperor." Once more, the priest would respond, "I do not know him." Only on the third knock, when the priest again asked who sought entrance, would the mourners answer, "A poor sinner, your brother."

And only then were the doors opened, and the procession allowed to enter.

This ancient custom beautifully expresses I today's Gospel truth: only the humble heart: finds favor before God. Jesus reminds us that • a sincere acknowledgment of our sinfulness our dependence on God's mercy—is the first I condition for the power and fruitfulness of our I prayer. (William J. Truly a Humble Heart

Dorothy Day, the great social reformer and cofounder of the Catholic Worker Movement, died in November 1980 at the age of 84. Upon her death, The New York Times called her "the most influential person in the history of American Catholicism."

In her autobiography, From Union Square to Rome, Dorothy described her gradual conversion to Christ. One of her earliest attractions to faith came in childhood, when she once saw the mother of a friend kneeling in prayer. The sight of that humble woman on her knees moved her deeply it was an image she never forgot.

Years later, before her conversion, Dorothy often spent long nights in taverns. Yet, something within her longed for more. In the early mornings, she would slip into St. Joseph's Church on Sixth Avenue. What drew her was not the preaching or the ritual, but the quiet faith of the people kneeling in prayer.

She later wrote: "I longed for their Faith... So, I used to go in and kneel in a back pew." In time, Dorothy received the gift of faith and entered the Church. Her journey reminds us that humility opens the heart to grace. It is the humble, the searching, the yearning soul that God draws to Himself.

Proud About What?

Once, a reporter asked St. Teresa of Calcutta—Mother Teresa—if she had ever been tempted to be proud of her work. With her familiar smile she replied, "Proud? Proud about what?"

The reporter answered, "Why, about the wonderful things you have done for the poorest of the poor!" Mother Teresa responded simply, " never knew I had done anything. It was God who worked in and through my Sisters and volunteers."

That is true humility. It is the quiet recognition that everything good in us is God's gift. The proud heart before God stands claiming worthiness; the humble heart kneels, knowing it is loved despite unworthiness. True humility, then, is what differentiates a saint from a sinner.

If we find ourselves proud of our talents, our family connections, our reputation, or our achievements, the Gospel gently reminds us: we need Jesus to free us from pride and to make us truly humble of heart.
